In the low to middle income countries however, the uptake of epidural labor analgesia is still low. This book, by looking at the obstetricians at the Kenyatta National Hospital's knowledge on epidural labor analgesia, attitude towards its routine use and how often they practiced it, tries to find out the reason behind the low uptake.
