Hastings prospect is about half a mile northeast of the Stroup and Rayfield prospects, or 2 miles S. 65 W. of Landers Chapel. It was opened by a 14-foot shaft and a crosscut trench. Cassiterite-bearing pegmatite was found on the surface for a distance of about 100 feet in a northeasterly direction. The country rock consists of interbedded hornblende schist and kyanitic mica gneiss, which strike northeast and have a high northwest dip.
